WEEK 2 PREVIEW

The league's newest member and one of the original five will meet to open the 2009 PFL conference race in Week 2. Meanwhile, three other league members will meet fellow FCS opposition on the road. In addition, Dayton gets its season underway placing all 10 PFL members on the gridiron for the first time this season.

Marist, the league's newest member, and **Drake**, one of the league's founders, will meet in Poughkeepsie, N.Y., to start the 2009 PFL race. Both teams were picked to finish in the league's lower half, Drake picked sixth while Marist received the eighth-place nod. Both squads opened the 2009 campaign's on a winning note, Marist winning at Sacred Heart while Drake posted a home shut-out against Grand View.

Morehead State meets Northeast Conference member St. Francis (Pa.), Saturday. The Eagles went 1-1 against the NEC last season, losing to Robert Morris but downing St. Francis, 36-21.

Jacksonville also will hit the road to meet FCS opposition when it meets Southern Conference member Samford. The Dolphins opened their campaign with a 40-24 victory at Webber International. Samford entered the season receiving votes in the Sports Network's FCS poll but fell to Central Florida in its opener.

San Diego will travel across the Rocky Mountains to meet the Big Sky's Northern Colorado. The Toreros will attempt to rev up their high powered offense in the rarefied air of Greeley, Colo. (at an altitude of 4,666 feet). The Bears opened their season with a 49-3 loss at FBS No. 25 Kansas.

Elsewhere in the league, **Campbell** will head south to meet Birmingham-Southern in the first of two games involving PFL members in Birmingham, Ala. The Camels will look for their first-ever back-to-back victories after opening the season with a win at home. **Davidson**, fresh off a loss at nationally-ranked Elon, opens its home schedule when it hosts Lenoir-Rhyne. **Dayton**, which did not play in Week 1, will get its campaign underway when it hosts Urbana at Welcome Stadium. **Butler** will stay in the state of Indiana for a second straight week, traveling to meet in-state foe Franklin. **Valparaiso** will seek its season's first victory when it meets Concordia (Wis.) in a battle of Lutheran-affiliated schools.

Sophomore, Quarterback, Bloomington, Ind.

Making his first collegiate start, Huck had a hand in all six touchdowns of Butler's 42-0 victory against Albion, Saturday. He completed 18-of-25 passes for 327 yards and threw for a school-record tying five touchdowns, including four second-quarter TD strikes. His 327 yards passing were the sixth most by an FCS quarterback in Week 1 and he posted the subdivision's third-best passer rating (239.87) among qualifying passers. Huck also posted a team-best 68 yards rushing on eight carries, including a three-yard touchdown run that capped the scoring in the third quarter.

Jaquan Bryant, Marist

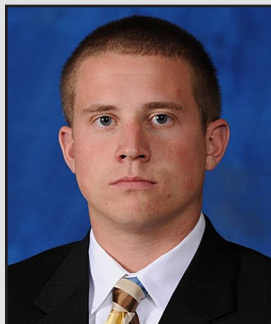
Sophomore, Cornerback, St. Albans, N.Y.

His first interception, an 11-yard return, opened the game's scoring in the first quarter. Bryant's second interception, a 15-yard return, closed the scoring with 1:31 remaining in the contest. He became the first FCS player this season to return two interceptions for touchdowns. Bryant also had five tackles (one solo) on the day and added a pass breakup.

Wubs was responsible for 10 points in Drake's 22-0 victory against Grand View, Saturday. He converted all three of his field goal attempts and made one of his two extra point tries. Wubs opened the game's scoring with a 37-yard field goal. He added a 32-yard field goal in the third quarter and a 25-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. In addition, Wubs punted four times for 178 yards (44.5 yards per punt), including a 51-yard boomer. He also handled kickoff duties where his six kickoffs averaged 57.7 yards.

2009 PFL COMPOSITE SCHEDULE

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to and end, Saturday, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at the home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

SAN DIEGO'S TRUJILLO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: For the fourth straight year the USD football program will be represented on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, bestowed annually upon the top player in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Senior quarterback Sebastian Trujillo (Durango, CO) is on the initial list of 20 candidates heading into the 2009 campaign. He follows in the footsteps of quarterback Josh Johnson (2006 & 2007) and wide receiver John Matthews (2008). In final voting, Johnson was 6th in 2006 and 3rd in 2007; Matthews placed 7th last season.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Saturday. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Dayton opens its 2009 campaign in Week 2 and will seek to extend the nation's longest streak of avoiding a shutout. The Flyers have not been shutout in 365 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times.

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
