WEEK 5 PREVIEW

All 10 Pioneer Football league teams take part in league contests during Week 5. It is one of only four weeks this season where every member is involved in a league affair during the same week.

The lone contest between squads with 1-0 PFL mark sees **San Diego** travel to **Butler**. The Bulldogs are off to a 4-0 start for the second consecutive season after surprising Morehead State in overtime last weekend. The Toreros took Week 4 off and have won the last seven meetings in the series. Butler last posted a victory against San Diego in the 2001 season.

Defending PFL champion **Jacksonville** begins its defense of that title when it hosts **Davidson** after an off week for both squads in Week 4. The Wildcats were the lone squad to put a blemish on the Dolphins conference record last season. Davidson came back from a 35-14 third-quarter deficit last season to record a 38-35 victory. Jacksonville won six straight PFL contests following that loss, a streak it takes into Saturday's contest.

Dayton, fresh off an impressive victory, travels to **Morehead State**, a team that suffered an overtime loss at home. The last three games in this series – all Morehead State victories – have been decided by a total of 15 points. The Flyers improved to 2-0 with senior Steve Valentino taking the snaps as they downed Duquesne in Dayton. The Eagles will seek to rebound from an overtime loss to Butler last weekend at Jayne Stadium.

The league's two newest members will meet for the first time when **Campbell** travels to **Marist**. Both teams are seeking their first PFL victories. The Camels did not record a victory in their first season and are 0-1 after a loss at Davidson in Week 3. The Red Foxes are 0-2 in their first PFL campaign, with losses to Drake and at San Diego.

Valparaiso will be the last squad to start its 2009 PFL campaign when it travels to **Drake**. The Bulldogs have won the last five in the series with the Crusaders last winning in 2003 courtesy an overtime decision. Both teams enter the outing following a loss in their last contest. Drake fell at South Dakota in Week 3 while Valparaiso fell to Carthage last week.

Huck followed disastrous first half with a remarkable second frame and led Butler to a 28-21 overtime victory at Morehead State, Saturday. Huck's first half was forgettable as he completed 10-of-24 passes for 65 yards and threw three interceptions. However, he recovered to lead the come-from-behind effort with a 16-of-25, 143-yard, four-touchdown second half performance. His 22-yard touchdown on the second play of overtime gave Butler its first lead of the game. Huck finished the game completing 26-of-49 passes for 208 yards. It is his third "Offensive Player of the Week" citation this season.

Harkness made Huck's life miserable in the first half, intercepting a PFL record tying three passes and returned one for a touchdown in Morehead State's 21-28 overtime loss, Saturday. Harkness' returned his first interception 63 yards for a touchdown to give Morehead State a 14-0 lead. His second interception stopped Butler's ensuing drive at the Morehead State six-yard line. He completed the trifecta with a pick in the opening moments of the second quarter. Harkness also was credited with two pass breakups for a total of five passes defended. He is the third FCS player to record three interceptions in a game this season.

2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOHNSON TABBED AS TAMPA BAY STARTER: The Tampa Bay Buccaneers announced today that second-year pro and former USD Torero Josh Johnson will start, Sunday at Washington. Tampa Bay head coach Raheem Morris made the announcement a day after the Bucs fell to 0-3 while gaining just 86 yards total offense in a 24-0 loss to the New York Giants. Johnson played one fourth-quarter series in the loss, completing 4 of 10 passes for 36 yards. He also finished as Tampa Bay's leading rusher, scrambling for a 15-yard gain on his only attempt. A fifth-round draft pick in 2008, Johnson made the 53-man roster as a rookie but was inactive for every game. At San Diego, he put up enormous numbers, including an NCAA FCS career record passing efficiency of 176.68. Johnson also ran for 1,864 yards and 19 touchdowns for the Toreros. As a senior, Johnson posted an incredible 43-1 touchdown-interception ratio while also rushing for 726 yards.

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at the home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

SAN DIEGO'S TRUJILLO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: For the fourth straight year the USD football program will be represented on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, bestowed annually upon the top player in Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Senior quarterback Sebastian Trujillo (Durango, CO) is on the initial list of 20 candidates heading into the 2009 campaign. He follows in

the footsteps of quarterback Josh Johnson (2006 & 2007) and wide receiver John Matthews (2008). In final voting, Johnson was 6th in 2006 and 3rd in 2007; Matthews placed 7th last season.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Including Saturday's victory against Duquesne, the Flyers have not been shutout in 369 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
