WEEK 8 PREVIEW

The second full week of PFL action this season puts all three of the league's unbeaten on the road. Butler travels to Campbell for the second straight season, Drake completes a 5,586-mile, two-week road trip when it travels to Davidson and Dayton heads north to Valparaiso. Meanwhile, Marist and Morehead State meet for the first time and Jacksonville literally goes coast-to-coast to meet San Diego.

Butler remained one of five overall unbeaten FCS squads with its win last week and will travel to North Carolina to face **Campbell**, whose lone win this season came at Barker-Lane Stadium. The Bulldogs are 6-0 for the first time since 1991 after they eked out a victory against Valparaiso in Week 7. Meanwhile, the Camels have lost five straight since its season-opening home victory, but showed promise against in a loss to Old Dominion last week.

Drake, another of the three PFL unbeaten, makes its own trek to North Carolina to meet **Davidson**. The Bulldogs traveled to San Diego in Week 7 and came out with a victory and now head to the nation's other coast to complete a two-week road trip of 5,586 miles. Davidson returns home after suffering a shutout loss at Dayton. The last two games in this series have been close, with a margin of three points each time – Davidson winning 24-21 at home in 2007 and Drake returning the favor with a 20-17 home win in 2008.

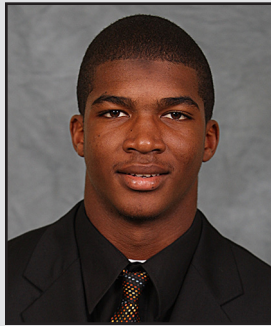
Following an off week, **Marist** returns to PFL action when it travels to **Morehead State**. The Red Foxes won their last two contests, leveling its PFL record at .500, before reaching their off week. Morehead State returns home looking to stop its four-game losing streak. Eagles head coach Matt Ballard will coach Saturday's affair in his bare feet in support of Samaritan's Feet, a non-profit organization whose goal is to provide shoes to impoverished children around the world.

Dayton, one of the three PFL's 3-0 squads, travels to **Valparaiso**. The Flyers have won five straight since senior Steve Valentino moved under center, including a shutout win of Davidson in Week 7. The Crusaders saw their upset bid turned aside at Butler last week and face their second-straight unbeaten PFL squad while still seeking their first PFL victory.

Jacksonville is still looking to remain within sight of the league leaders and will travel to **San Diego** in a coast-to-coast excursion. The Dolphins suffered their only loss in Week 6 but rebounded with a shutout home win last week and are one game behind the leaders. The Toreros stay home after suffering a late-game loss to unbeaten Drake in Torero Stadium last week.

Philpart caught a pair of touchdown passes as Jacksonville posted a 39-0 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. He finished the day with six catches for 192 yard and is ranked among the FCS's top-20 single-game performances by yardage. Philpart opened the day's scoring with a 29-yard touchdown reception. He then closed the scoring with a 34-yard touchdown score in the third quarter. It is his second outing of 190 or more yards this season.

Joe Ries, Dayton

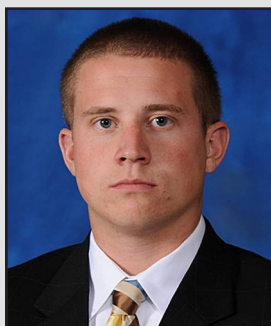
Senior, Linebacker, Cincinnati, Ohio.

He led a Flyer defense that held Davidson's offense below its season average with just 228 yards.

2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

BUTLER ONE OF FIVE REMAINING UNBEATENS IN FCS: Butler enters Week 8 as one of five remaining unbeaten teams in the FCS. The Bulldogs are joined by the Colgate (7-0, Patriot), Montana (7-0, Big Sky), New Hampshire (6-0, Colonial) and Richmond (6-0, Colonial) as the only teams left with an unblemished mark this season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT AT SIGNAL CALLER: A youth movement is afoot among the PFL's quarterback corps. Four teams – Butler, Drake, Jacksonville and Valparaiso – have regularly used a sophomore signal caller this season while Marist has seen its sophomore quarterback split time with a senior. Three sophomores – Butler's Andrew Huck, Jacksonville's Josh McGregor and Drake's Mike Pitkowski – are ranked 1-2-3 among the league's passing yardage leaders. No. 4 on the list is Dayton senior quarterback Steve Valentino who is starting at quarterback for the first time in his collegiate career. In addition, San Diego has turned to redshirt freshman Sam Scudellari (No. 5 on the list) to take the snaps the rest of this season after senior Sebastian Trujillo left the team due to personal reasons.

PFL ALUMNI IN THE NFL: Two PFL alumni are seeing regular playing time as professionals. San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson is the starting quarterback for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, getting the nod in Week 3 at Washington. Drake alumnus Billy Cundiff was picked up as a kicker by the Cleveland Browns and also made his first 2009 appearance during Week 3 at Baltimore. It is Johnson's second season in the NFL while Cundiff is in his sixth season.

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at their home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of

several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

MORE ABOUT VICTORIES: Last season, Dayton became the 11th NCAA FCS team – and the first west of the Alleghenies – to win at least 600 games in its football history when it downed Davidson. Here are the 12 members of the club, heading into the 2009 season. Yale (853), Harvard (798), Penn (796), Princeton (780), Fordham (738), Dartmouth (643), Lafayette (640), Delaware (633), Lehigh (625), Cornell (616), Dayton (603) and North Dakota State (601).

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Including Saturday's victory against Davidson, the Flyers have not been shutout in 371 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:
